		 On Chairperson Morallos' question on how to avoid the issue of Energy Management System (EMS) non-updating and request for information on the need to enhance the EMS, Mr. Ambrocio R. Rosales (System Operator) commented that the non- updating status was probably due to problems encountered at the plant site either with the remote telemetering unit (RTU) or communication facility. Mr. Rosales believed there was a protocol on this, such that the plant operator would immediately coordinate with the SO and the MO. He said there was a need to scan inhibit until the problem was resolved. 	
		On the EMS enhancement, Mr. Rosales commented that one solution to address the non-updating status was for the MO to run the State Estimator (SE). He believed the MO relies more	

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	on the real-time data over the SE. The SO, on the other hand, uses real-time data, converts it into SE, then uses the actual values in the technical simulation, i.e. running the Power Flow Solution, to provide an accurate action to address network problems.
	 On the RCC's requests from NPC in item 5.2 (i.e. 1) NPC/Angat Hydropower plant representatives to present their concerns and protocols, and 2) NPC to formally inform the RCC regarding its decision on whether they will pursue their proposal or not), the Secretariat informed the RCC that NPC has yet to inform the RCC of its decision.
	On the agreement in item 5.3 that IEMOP would set a meeting with MEI/PEI and NGCP to resolve the operational concerns, Mr. Olmedo said that the meeting occurred on 13 January 2023. He also said they discussed MEI/PEI's concern regarding SO re-dispatch and the differences between "constrained-on based on PSM" and "constrained on based on MOT". He added that there is an internal generation schedule in case the RTD provided before the Intervention is not implementable anymore.
	Mr. Clark N. Agustin (NGCP) said that the regional MOT is used locally for the balancing while the national MOT is for the sharing of the resources. For the example of Mindanao under an Intervention, the national MOT would still hold but the Mindanao entries would not be considered. The priority for the local correction is the regional MOT while it would be the national MOT for the sharing of resources. If there is Market Intervention, the national MOT could be used as a last resort.

	Ms. Cruz provided a brief background on the RCC's process in signing the RCC documents. Since the pandemic, the RCC has allowed the Secretariat to affix e-signatures after explicit Page 13 of 29

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	approval to do so. However, a question was recently raised on the appropriateness of the procedure due to security purposes. The Secretariat suggested to use a third-party application to secure e-signing of documents. This will also be incorporated in the process of the Secretariat in compliance with the e-commerce law to have proper procedure in securing e-signature.
	She added that requiring a third-party application will require a conscious action from the RCC, which would require each member to open the file to sign the document. In addition, this process will affect the Secretariat's process timeline.
	 Atty. Rachel Angela P. Anosan (Independent) said that the RCC may consider using the Adobe Sign application since PEMC has subscription to it. She added that though it may take time and conscious action from the members, she thinks that it is the proper way to do the signing of digital documents.
	 Alternatively, Chairperson Morallos said using digital signature, which is encrypted, is also secure. He shared his experience that when he is signing a decision using digital signature, the decision can be enforced by a sheriff. The digital signature is encrypted and recognized by the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT). He suggested that instead of using third-party application, PEMC or the RCC may consider the registration of digital signatures in the DICT. He also suggested to contact DICT and request a seminar or training on the digital signature. This will also officialize the documents being signed by the signatories.
	Atty. Gabriel R. Marmeto (PEMC) said that PEMC is currently coordinating with the DICT and thanked Chairperson Morallos for his help.
	On the query who among the RCC members have digital signatures, Ms. Lorreto Rivera (Supply) said that she has a DICT-certified signature, which is being used by the Management in their company. She noted that approval is needed, however, if it will be used externally.
	Prof. Jordan Rel C. Orillaza (Independent) said that he has a DICT-certified signature, but he only uses it for very critical documents. He asked how critical the RCC documents are, and

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	if it will be alright to use e-signature rather than the DICT-certified digital signature.
	Atty. Anosan explained that it is not necessary for the body to use a DICT-certified signature, and that third-party application would suffice. It is the better way than pasting an image of one's signature.

	Ms. Papa said that there is no need to submit new rules change proposal since the DOE is already scheduling a public consultation on the proposed penalty framework on test and commissioning. 


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
