Request for Extension of Effectivity of Urgent Amendments to the WESM Manual on Ancillary Services Monitoring regarding Reserve Conformance Standards and Related Enforcement Actions

Effective Date : 10 April 2026

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WHEREAS, on 10 December 2024, the PEM Board approved the RCC Resolution No. 2024-08¹ entitled *Proposed Revisions to the Urgent Amendments to the Ancillary Services Monitoring Manual (ASMM) regarding Reserve Conformance Standards and Related Enforcement Actions*, which aims to implement:

- 1) Changes in timeline and procedure for monitoring compliance with the Reserve Conformance Standards and enforcement thereof to streamline the process, enhance submission/documentation by Ancillary Services Providers (ASPs), and lead to a more comprehensive and quality assessment by Enforcement and Compliance Office (ECO); and
- 2) Additional technical considerations in monitoring Response Accuracy on Governor Control Mode (GCM) to resolve technical issues identified during the August 2024 to November 2024 monitoring period to ensure fair assessment of the compliance of the ASPs;

WHEREAS, in accordance with the rules change process for urgent amendments², the revised WESM Manual on Ancillary Services Monitoring was posted in the WESM Governance Arm Website on 11 December 2024, with changes that are effective until 6 months from the date of posting (i.e. 12 December 2024 until 12 June 2025) or until the corresponding general amendment on the same matter is promulgated by the DOE, whichever is earlier;

WHEREAS, the rules change process for the corresponding general amendments³ was initiated by the RCC through online publication of the PEM Board-approved urgent proposal on the Governance Arm website, to solicit comments from WESM participants and interested parties. The consultation period ran from 16 December 2024 to 03 February 2025, during which comments were received from nine (9) stakeholders⁴;

WHEREAS, the RCC proceeded to deliberate on and finalize the general proposed amendments over three (3) meetings⁵, approved the endorsement of the same to the PEM Board, as revised, per RCC Resolution No. 2025-02 dated 30 April 2025; and in the same Resolution likewise recommended extending the effectivity of the urgent amendments for another six (6) months (until 12 December 2025), as permitted in the Section 7.4 (g) of the Rules Change Manual;

WHEREAS, the PEM Board approved the general amendments and the recommended extension of the effectivity of the urgent amendments until 12 December 2025 pursuant to PEM Board Resolution No. 2025-85-02 dated 28 May 2025, and endorsed the same to the DOE for final approval on 11 June 2025;

WHEREAS, the DOE has concluded its public consultations on the draft Department Circular regarding the proposal with the Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao legs on 02 September (Muntinlupa City), 24 September (Cebu City) and 07 October 2025 (Cagayan de Oro City), respectively. These consultations provided WESM members and stakeholders the opportunity to submit their comments;

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WHEREAS, following the conclusion of the DOE public consultations, the PEM Board approved the second extension of the urgent amendments through PEM Board Resolution No. 2025-90-02 dated 27 November 2025;

WHEREAS, pending the approval and promulgation by the DOE of the corresponding general amendments, the current effectivity of the PEM Board-approved urgent amendments is due to expire on 12 June 2026, the RCC again recommends extending the effectivity of the urgent amendments for another six (6) months (i.e. until 12 December 2026) or until the DOE approved the corresponding general amendments;

NOW THEREFORE, we, the undersigned, on behalf of the sectors we represent, hereby resolve that extending the implementation of the PEM-Board approved Urgent Amendments is necessary, considering the material impact on the compliance monitoring to the Reserve Conformance Standards should the said amendments cease to take effect;

RESOLVED, that the RCC approves and recommends to the PEM Board extending the effectivity of the PEM-Board Approved Urgent Amendments to the WESM Manual on Ancillary Services Monitoring regarding Reserve Conformance Standards and Related Enforcement Actions for another six (6) months or until the DOE approved the corresponding general amendments;
